

Planning Sheet: Climate Change: STEAM

The Aberbury Festival has always been concerned about Climate Change issues. Rewise and Wates are inviting you to prepare something for Junkfest.

Task: Make musical instruments from recycled materials. Create and record a piece of music and perform it as a group. Your lyrics should contain climate change messages, so it is both educational and entertaining.

- 1. Gather a variety of materials so that different sounds can be created.
- 2. Write some song lyrics. Think about how your words or lines rhyme. Rhyming words end with the same sounds, for example, love and above. The spelling does not matter, the words just have to sound the same (or similar) e.g. moon and June. (Websites such as RhymeZone can help you.)
- 3. It is a good idea to stack up rhymes for key words before you begin. For example: in a song about climate change, you are likely to use the word 'earth'. A rhyme stack could include: birth, mirth, worth and dearth.



- 4. Create the junk sounds to go with your lyrics. Rehearse.
- 5. Rehearse and rehearse again.
- 6. Rehearse and record your song using whatever technology your school has available.

Extension work:

Give your band a name. Imagine your song is released onto streaming services. Create the 'cover' to display the band name, title, and create some artwork to illustrate what the song is about.
